The boats are all floating in the water. Can you find some other things that float? Maybe you can find some things that sink! Why not watch this little clip about floating and sinking and then have a little experiment.

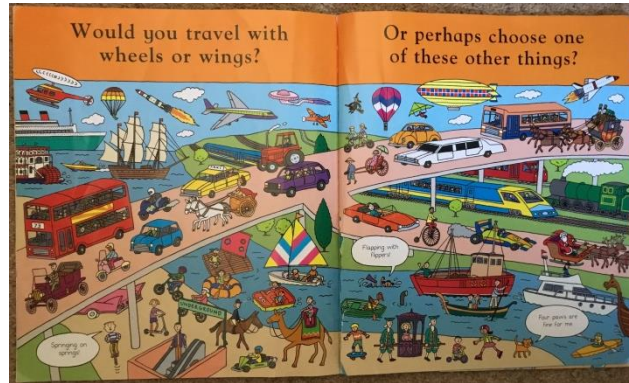
